Gardens of Cornwall, Bath, and the Chelsea Flower Show May 13-May 25, 2023



Day 1: Saturday 13th May

Arrive London Heathrow early morning.

Depart for Bath for a visit to Highgrove the country home of the Charles & Camilla, HRH Prince of Wales and the Duchess of Cornwall (subject to availability).

Over 40 years in the making, the gardens at Highgrove are some of the most creatively inspiring and innovative in the United Kingdom. The series of interlinked gardens reflects The Prince's natural artistic ability. Managed organically and sustainably, the gardens have become an important haven for a rich variety of flora and fauna.

The gardens are open to visitors on selected dates between April and October each year.

If unavailable, a visit Bowood House (lunch included) will be arranged, a magnificent Georgian country house with interiors by Robert Adam set within 100 acres of beautifully landscaped 'Capability' Brown Parkland. Surrounding the house is the Italian-inspired Terrace Garden, the Private Walled Gardens, and the herbaceous border, all radiating colour throughout the seasons.

Continue to the UNESCO World Heritage City of Bath with the rest of the day at leisure.

Welcome dinner included at restaurant in Bath

Day 2: Sunday 14th May

Today we will visit some gardens close to Bath, with our first visit to Prior Park, a beautiful and intimate 18th-century landscape garden created by local entrepreneur Ralph Allen and designed by the poet Alexander Pope in collaboration with landscape gardener Capability Brown. Probably its most famous

feature is the Palladian Bridge, an elegant and eye-catching example of this style of architecture, built in 1755, and only one of three of its kind built in England.

Lunch will be included today.

In the afternoon continue to Courts Garden, a delightful English country garden, full of variety and displaying the English country style at its best.

Peaceful water gardens and herbaceous borders, with organically shaped topiary, demonstrate an imaginative use of colour and planting, creating unexpected vistas. Stroll through the arboretum with its wonderful species of trees and naturally planted spring bulbs.

Return to Bath with the evening free for independent dining in one of Bath's many fine restaurants.

Day 3: Monday 15th May

Depart Bath for Cornwall. En route stop in Wells for a visit to the Bishop's Palace, home to the Bishops of Bath and Wells for over 800 years. The stunning medieval palace, along with its 14 acres of RHS partner gardens lies in the heart of the medieval city.

As well as viewing the Bishop's private Chapel and the now ruined Great Hall, there will be ample time to explore the garden. Wander along the many herbaceous borders, savour the scent of roses in the parterre, admire from the top of the ramparts the beautiful views of the gardens, moat and further afield, meander through the Arboretum, admire the reflection of Wells Cathedral in one of the well pools, explore what is growing in the Community Garden and, finally, take a moment to recharge

your batteries in the contemporary Garden of Reflection.

Afterwards there will be time for independent lunch in Wells. Time permitting you may want to visit the magnificent medieval Cathedral.

Continue this afternoon for visit to Hestercombe near Taunton. Hestercombe Gardens offer a unique and varied experience encapsulating three distinct periods of garden design spanning three centuries: Georgian Landscape Garden (designed 1750s), the Victorian Shrubbery and the Edwardian Formal Gardens (early 1900s).

Afterwards continue journey to Cornwall and check-in to your hotel in St Ives for a 4-night stay.

Dinner in hotel tonight.

Day 4: Tuesday 16th May

Depart hotel after breakfast and travel to St Austell on Cornwall's south coast. Our first visit today will be to the Lost Gardens of Heligan.

Abandoned after World War I, this garden was "lost" for decades until teams of volunteers literally unearthed it in the 1990's. Following the removal of tons of overgrowth, a garden with roots in the 17th century was revealed.

The garden is best described as a whole series of gardens within a garden – there are 5 walled gardens – each of their own particular interest. Included in the restoration is a 22-acre section of the garden that sweeps down a valley with a large collection of tree ferns and bamboo. There should be a good display of azaleas and rhododendrons on the grounds in early May as well.

Next continue to the Eden Project, a monumental garden under glass taking up an area the size of 30 football pitches. The garden was built in a derelict clay pit near the town of St Austell on the southern Cornish coast. Each of the gigantic conservatories represent a climate zone – Mediterranean, South African, Rainforest, Californian, etc. Many exotic rainforest plants grow alongside ornamentals. This is a relatively young garden (as far as English gardens go) and should be a very exciting and different kind of gardening experience.

Return to St Ives with evening free.

Day 5: Wednesday 17th May

Depart the hotel this morning and travel to Truro and visit Tremenheere Sculpture Garden which lies in a beautiful, sheltered valley overlooking St Michael's Mount; the woods, stream and dramatic vistas provide the perfect setting for large-scale exotic and sub-tropical planting.

Interwoven with the planting is an evolving programme of contemporary artwork by internationally renowned artists such as James Turrell, David Nash and Richard Long, skilfully harmonising their works within this unique landscape.

Continue in the afternoon to another wonderful sub-tropical spring garden. Trewidden, created by Thomas Bolitho during the 19th century, is a beautiful garden of 15 acres which holds a vibrant range of over 300 Magnolias and Camellias that lie beside a large tree fern dell. A maze of paths will lead you to different areas of this tranquil Cornish Garden adorned with shrubs and champion trees, some of which are more than 100 years old. These attractions can be seen alongside rare species of plants, not normally cultivated in this country.

Return to St Ives for some free time.

Dinner tonight in Harbourside restaurant in St lves.

Day 6: Thursday 18th May

Free day in St Ives to explore this charming town.

Suggested activities outside of St Ives include a short taxi drive to Penzance to tour art galleries and shops. Or take a ferry or helicopter from Penzance to the Scilly Islands for a day tour of more gardens. You could also tour the historic Minack theatre that juts out into the sea or visit an old tin mine that made Cornwall famous centuries ago. Mousehole is another option which is a picturesque fishing village on the coast.

A local bus company does an hourly tour of the coast at

Day 7: Friday 19th May

Depart St Ives this morning for Torquay.

En route we will visit a couple of well-known Cornish gardens. Trelissick, is both a garden and an estate of rare tranquil beauty, set amidst more than 500 acres of sweeping park and farmland with glorious panoramic views towards Falmouth and the open sea. The garden is famed particularly for its large collection of hydrangeas, camellias, rhododendrons and exotic and tender plants, which thrive in the mild Cornish climate. There is a dell which has tree ferns, hostas, and hellebores as well as a walled garden with aromatic plants.

Continue this afternoon to Cotehele. This fourteen-acre property on the slopes overlooking the Tamar River was in the Edgcumbe family for over 600 years. The house is one of the least altered medieval houses in Britain. There are also remnants of the earlier centuries on view throughout the garden with a beehive-shaped dovecote and a Medieval stewpond. Nearest the house are the Terrace Gardens which on the east side of the house are probably the most formally planted. Here you'll find seasonally mixed borders of hydrangeas, roses, geraniums, spring tulips, magnolias, azaleas and a towering handkerchief tree in the northeast corner. Drop through a tunnel to the steeply sloped Valley Garden filled with exotic sub-tropical plants. At the base of the garden, a gate takes you to the tiny Chapel-in-the-Wood, built by Sir Richard Edgcumbe. Finally, you reach the Cotehele Quay offering maritime exhibits, a restored sailing barge, a fine art gallery, and refreshments at the Edgcumbe Arms. In the 19th century local industries boomed and Cotehele Quay bustled with vessels loading and unloading cargo. Paddle steamers came upriver to see the Tamar Valley's famous blossoming orchards and small boats carried market produce back down the river for sale.

Continue this afternoon for Torquay

Dinner tonight in hotel

Day 8: Saturday 20th May

Depart today for a full program of visits starting with The Garden House near Yelverton.

The Garden House is a true plantsperson's garden, this inspirational garden blends seamlessly into a timeless Devon landscape. The 8-acre garden is really several gardens in one, using over 6,000 varieties of plants to great effect in both traditional and naturalistic planting styles. A 2-acre arboretum with a lake and ornamental bridges is a recent addition celebrating the Golden Jubilee of the Fortescue Garden Trust. There are magnificent collections of camellias, magnolias, and rhododendrons. We will experience the delights of the famous Walled Garden, considered by some to be the finest in Great Britain, built around medieval ruins. Other features include the Wisteria bridges, a romantic Cottage Garden, a Wild Flower Meadow, a South African garden, a Summer garden and Quarry rock garden, a thatched barn and a 16th century tower.

Continue afterwards to Buckfast Abbey, located in the heart of a picturesque valley on the edge of Dartmoor National Park, home to a community of Roman Catholic Benedictine Monks, who live their lives of prayer, work and study according to the ancient rule of St Benedict.

The Abbey complex includes beautiful, spacious gardens, a restaurant, multiple shops, a conference centre, a hotel plus a range of guest accommodation. There will be an opportunity for independent lunch in the Abbey restaurant.

Continue this afternoon for a scenic journey through the rugged Dartmoor National Park and stop for a luxurious afternoon tea at the five-star Bovey Castle hotel.

Return to Torquay later this afternoon.

Day 9: Sunday 21st May

Depart Torquay via visits to Knightshayes Garden. This is a large garden known for its wonderful woodland plantings and collection of trees.

The garden is one of the finest in Devon and its collection represents one of the most varied in the National Trust; with over 1200 plant species, many unique to Knightshayes. Covering an area of just over four acres, the walled kitchen garden is another great highlight, brimming with seasonal produce. The vistas of the terrace gardens contrast with the sheltered woodlands and the tranquil pools. The striking Gothic Victorian mansion is a rare example of the work of William Burges, whose richly decorated interiors have always inspired extremes in opinion. Full of quirks and curiosities, there are gargoyles, corbels and a medieval inspired great hall.

Next we visit East Lambrook, which may be the quintessential English Cottage Garden. Created by the doyen of cottage gardening Margery Fish. The garden mixes everyday English plants with rarer species to showcase Mrs Fish's garden style developed between 1938 and 1969. The garden was maintained by the Fish family for a while but finally passed out of their ownership in the 1980s.

Since then, the garden has been maintained by several different owners and is now under the stewardship of current owners Gail & Mike Werkmeister. Although now more mature, the garden is still essentially as Mrs Fish originally created it

Continue afterwards to the cathedral city of Salisbury and check in to your hotel.

Dinner at hotel,

Day 10: Monday 22nd May

We depart hotel this morning and head to naval town of Portsmouth for a visit to the Mary Rose Museum in the Royal Naval Dockyards. The Mary Rose was Henry VIII's favorite warship, built in 1510. In service for 34 years, it sank in 1545 during a confrontation between the respective fleets of the French and English in an area of water known as the Solent just of the English coast. Discovered in 1971, it was raised from the seabed in 1982 and is now in the final stages of conservation. She takes her place in a stunning and unique museum.

This afternoon visit the Sir Howard Hillier garden. In 1953 the distinguished plantsman, Sir Harold Hillier, established the Gardens and Arboretum. Over the many years he assembled a remarkable collection, in the aim to bring together the most comprehensive and unrivalled collection of trees, shrubs and hardy plants in the UK.

The Gardens were left under the sole trusteeship of Hampshire County Council in 1977. Run as a charity, the Gardens are continually developed to further Sir Harold's philosophy of horticulture, conservation, education and recreation.

Return to Salisbury with the remainder of the day and evening free.

Day 11: Tuesday 23rd May

Depart Salisbury for London. En route visit a vineyard for winetasting and light lunch. With a climate and "terroir" not that dissimilar to that found in the Champagne region of France, southern English vineyards have developed a

growing reputation for producing high quality sparkling wines.

Continue for visit to Down House, Charles Darwin's family home and a site of outstanding international significance.

Step into the very rooms where Charles Darwin worked and lived, including the study where he wrote 'On the Origin of the Species', and discover a fascinating exhibition about his work. Follow in the great scientist's footsteps as you explore the award-winning gardens where he spent many hours making observations and conducting experiments that helped develop his ground-breaking theories. Meander down his 'thinking path', stroll past bountiful vegetable patches and enjoy fragrant flower beds all surrounded by the tranquil countryside.

Afterward we continue into London and check in to your centrally located hotel.

Day 12: Wednesday 24th May

Transfer provided to Chelsea Flower, Britain's premier horticultural show of the year and a Mecca for garden lovers from all over the world. Leave when you are ready and have the rest of the day free for independent sightseeing or shopping.

Return independently to hotel.

Farewell dinner in restaurant in walking distance to hotel.
